Condemning Hate and Affirming Freedom of Speech on Campus Adopted AFT Massachusetts Executive Board February 3, 2024

WHEREAS: intellectual freedom is foundational to a representative democracy and

enshrined in the First Amendment freedoms of speech and expression,

conscience and assembly; and

WHEREAS: people cannot truly exercise their rights without the open and robust debate of

ideas, free from intimidation, violence and threat of violence; and

WHEREAS: U.S. colleges and universities are central to the development and promotion of

intellectual freedom and should be sites of free and open debate, where difficult—sometimes painful—topics and opposing ideas should be discussed, challenged, and debated in ways that respect diversity of thought and the dignity and

humanity of all; and

WHEREAS: to secure this freedom of thought and expression, institutions of higher

education have an obligation to ensure environments where students, staff and faculty are free to engage in these exchanges without facing intimidation or racially, politically, or religiously motivated attacks and threats of violence;

and

WHEREAS: faculty, staff and students have both rights and obligations in the exercise of

intellectual freedom, including the responsibility to exercise their freedoms in

ways that respect the rights of those with whom they disagree; and

WHEREAS: higher education as a site of free speech and protest is even more essential and

necessary during times of unrest and uncertainty; and

WHEREAS: misinformation campaigns and legislative attacks are used to stoke the culture

wars on campus and continue a cycle of hate and bigotry that has resulted in an increase in racism, anti-semitism, Islamophobia and anti LGBTQIA+ hate on

campus; and

WHEREAS: the violence, threats of violence and intimidation we recently have seen on

campuses create an environment that puts students, faculty, staff, and other members of the campus community at risk, making it an environment where freedoms are undermined, our country further divided, and our democracy

further eroded; and

WHEREAS: students, faculty, staff and other members of campus communities have been

subject to social media attacks, doxing campaigns and death threats; and
